Sunday, December 8 @ 2:00 pm


Organized by the Newtown Business Association, this parade is a huge event that continues to provide a magical experience for the whole community. In past years the parade has boasted over 1,800 participants and 5,000+ community members lining the streets! This year, the parade will be bigger and better than ever with lots of surprises in store for spectators. Stay tuned!

The parade promptly kicks off at 2PM from South State Street at the Stocking Works. It then continues north to Washington Avenue and makes a left turn, then turns right onto Sycamore Street, ending at the corner of Sycamore St. and Durham Rd. Come early to get prime spectator seating along the parade route.



PARKING PERMIT REGULATIONS

Parking permits are valid from 1/1/2025 through 12/31/2025

- The cost of the permit is \$200.00
- Permits are **ONLY** valid in the municipal parking lot located at 10 West Centre Avenue by the Old Newtown Beer Store and Wine and Spirit Shop.
- The permit allows you to exceed the 3 hour parking limit
- Permits are required Monday through Saturday
- Permits **must be visibly** displayed on the inside rear-view mirror
- If the permit is not properly displayed and a ticket is issued, there will be a **\$5.00** Administrative withdrawal fee. Repeated violations of this violation and failure to pay this fee may result in the cancellation of the permit.
- Permits are **NOT** valid for **ANY** on-street parking (example: state street and centre avenue)
- Expired permits <u>MUST</u> be returned to the newtown borough police department. If permits are not turned in, then you can not purchase a new permit for the next year

NEWTOWN BOROUGH TAXES

In Newtown Borough, we have a few different types of local taxes:

1) Judy S. Musto, Elected Tax Collector

- Real Estate Tax The elected tax collector issues two real estate tax bills
 to every property owner each year. The first bill is mailed by March 1 and
 those funds go to Bucks County and Newtown Borough. The second bill is
 mailed by July 1 and those taxes go to the Council Rock School District.
- Occupational Tax The elected tax collector issues this tax bill by July 1
 to everyone 18 years old or older who resides in Newtown Borough and
 works full or part-time. These funds also go to the Council Rock School District. For those who have retired, moved, taken a
 new job, changed occupations, or have any other questions relating to their Occupational Assessment, please contact
 taxoffice@crsd.org.

2% discounts are available to taxpayers who pay within the first two months of billing. Further questions regarding these two types of taxes should be directed to Judy at taxcollector@boroughofnewtown.com or by visiting website https://jsmusto.wixsite.com/boro.

2) Keystone Collections Agency, Appointed Tax Collector

• In addition to the above, Keystone Collections Agency is the Bucks County appointed collector of earned income tax (EIT) and local services tax (LST), and they can be reached at www.keystonecollects.com. The 1% EIT is split evenly between the Council Rock School District and Newtown Borough. Like federal and state income tax, residents file local tax returns by April 15 each year.

Delinquent taxes are handled differently, depending on the type of tax and taxing authority to whom the funds are paid. Collections of these taxes are as follows:

In 2023, the Council Rock School District enacted a Property Tax & Rent Rebate Program similar to the existing rebate program offered by the state of PA and administered by the PA Dept. of Revenue for seniors and individuals with permanent disabilities. Eligibility requirements are age and income based. Contact www.crsd.org.

In 2024, the PA Dept. of Revenue raised the maximum rebate from \$650 to \$1000 for property owners and renters earning up to \$45,000 per year. Visit revenue.pa.gov for more information.



NEWS FROM THE EAC

How to Continue to Practice Sustainability over the Thanksgiving, Christmas, Hanukkah, and Kwanzaa Holidays

As enjoyable as the holiday season is, it's also a time when waste soars to alarming levels. Household waste increases by 25% between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day in the United States alone—that's about 5 million tons of garbage produced. (Architectural Digest, 10/23)

However, breakneck buying and excess waste that happens over the holidays is hurting the planet. It is part of an unsustainable consumer culture that is feeding a triple planetary crisis of climate change, nature and biodiversity loss, and pollution and waste.

Ultimately, by integrating sustainability into holiday practices, you help foster a healthier, more equitable world for everyone.

12 tips that will contribute to a healthier planet while enjoying the season:

- 1. **Eco-Friendly Wrapping:** Use reusable gift wrap like fabric or old newspapers, or get creative with materials you already have around the house. Gardening pots are easy to fill with gardening supplies. A mixing bowl or stockpot makes an excellent package for your favorite cook. (Then save clothing boxes, ribbons, bows and wrapping paper to reuse next year).
- 2. **Sustainable Decorations:** Decorate with natural elements like pinecones, dried fruits, or potted plants that can be reused or composted after the season.
- 3. **Conscious Consumption:** Plan meals carefully to minimize food waste. Use leftovers creatively and compost scraps when possible.
- 4. Support Local: Shop at local markets or small businesses to reduce transportation emissions and support your community.
- 5. Digital Cards: Consider sending e-cards instead of paper cards, or choose cards made from recycled materials.
- 6. **Travel Smart:** If traveling, consider carpooling, using public transport, or offsetting your carbon footprint through reputable programs.
- 7. **Look into alternative Christmas trees** rent, or turn your houseplant into a tree! (cut trees are a greener choice than artificial trees.)
- 8. **Switch to LED lights**, which use up to 80% less energy. Use Energy Star qualified LED (Light Emitting Diode) lights. They are 90 percent more efficient than traditional lights and LED's last longer.
- 9. **Experiences over things:** Consider gift options such as a spa day, cooking class, or weekend getaway. Also great are gift certificates to local museums, concerts, restaurants, theaters, etc.
- 10. **Online shopping hacks:** Today, most people shop online. To reduce waste, bundle your online purchases and look for retailers that use minimal packaging or eco-friendly packing materials.
- 11. **Reusable tableware:** Opt for reusable dinnerware and cloth napkins instead of disposable options to reduce the pile-up of plastic and paper products. Then, store leftovers in reusable glass containers rather than single-use plastic ones to keep them fresh and curb additional waste.
- 12. **Look for gifts that don't require batteries:** If you must buy a product that needs batteries, buy rechargeable batteries and give them with the gift.

NEWTOWN BOROUGH POINTS OF INTEREST

Bird in Hand Private Residence

111 S. State Street

Built prior to 1690 and one of the oldest frame houses in Pennsylvania. A marker in the garden describes a skirmish at this site in 1778 with British troops.

County Office Building First National Bank Offices

34 S. State Street

Built in 1796 as the County Office Building when Newtown was the county seat from 1726 to 1813.

The Court Inn (Half-Moon Inn)* Newtown Historic Association, Inc. Open to the Public Court Street & Centre Avenue 215,968,4004

Built in 1733 and originally called The Half Moon Inn. It is known as The Court Inn because it is located diagonally across from the former site of the Court House building and was a popular pub in town.

Edward Hicks House Private Residence

122 Penn Street

Built in 1821 by Edward Hicks. This house is constructed of Pennsylvania fieldstone and was considered a modest home at the time it was built.

Newtown Borough Council Chambers*

23 N. State Street

Built in 1854 to house the Borough offices and jail. Newtown Borough was incorporated April 16, 1838.

6 Newtown Common Historic Marker

100 N. State Street (rear)

In 1683 when Newtown was surveyed, thirty acres along Newtown Creek were reserved for free use of water and pasture land. This tranquil small park still remains public property.

Newtown Creek Bridge*

W. Centre Avenue

Built in 1796, this double-arched stone bridge is the oldest stone bridge in Bucks County and the fourth oldest in Pennsylvania.

Newtown Friends Meeting House and Burial Grounds*

219 Court Street

Built in 1817. Painter Edward Hicks, recognized as a leading minister of the Meeting, was often in attendance. Hicks is buried in the graveyard.

Newtown Library Company Open to the Public

114 Centre Avenue 215,968,7659

Third oldest library in Pennsylvania, serving the community since 1760.

Linton Memorial Park

199 S. Lincoln Ave.

Family Park features a Peaceable Kingdom sculpture.

Brian S. Gregg Memorial Park

129 N. Congress Street

Playground and park located next to the Chancellor Center.

12 Newtown Theatre

120 N. State Street

Built in 1831, it is the oldest continuously operating movie theater in the US.

Patriots Park

112 Court Street

Site of the Revolutionary War skirmish in 1778, when Loyalists raided the property where tailors were making and mending uniforms for the soldiers camped at Valley Forge.

Environmental Disposal Hazard Notice to our Customers - Please Read!

Dear Valued Customer,

Please be advised of the following environmental disposal hazard notice which is becoming more prevalent and dangerous to our customers, our drivers, and our communities.

The use of lithium-ion batteries, also known as "button batteries," has been steadily increasing over the last 15 years. They can be found in consumer electronics, power tools, medical equipment, electric cars, and many other devices. While lithium-ion batteries have proven to be a low cost and effective power source, they are extremely volatile in the wrong conditions and therefore, can be a serious fire hazard.

Leck Waste Services experienced 3 waste truck fires within the last year because of lithium-ion batteries in the waste stream. These batteries ignite when ruptured and should never be disposed of in regular trash. Below is a photo of what will occur when a lithium-ion battery is ruptured. When these batteries are ruptured in a trash truck, a fire will surely result and the potential for injury, death and property damage is very significant.

To our Commercial Customers: improperly disposed of lithium-ion batteries puts your employees and facilities at risk as well as Leck Waste Services employees and equipment.

<u>To our Residential Customers</u>: At residential locations, improperly disposed of lithium-ion batteries puts yourself, your home, and your property at risk.

<u>To ALL Customers:</u> We strongly encourage all our customers to inform all employees of your commercial business or all members of your household of the proper disposal for lithium-ion batteries.

The EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) states that lithium-ion batteries must be processed by an appropriate recycler and never disposed of with your trash. You should never store lithium-Ion batteries touching each other and to prevent fires, tape battery terminals and/or place lithium-ion batteries in separate plastic bags. https://www.epa.gov/recycle/used-lithium-ion-batteries





Addition items that should not be placed in the waste stream; flammable liquids, propane tanks, car batteries, oil-based paint, any compressed gas cylinder, hot coals, paint thinner, and pool chemicals. Under PA law anyone who is found to be disposing of these items can be held legally and financially responsible. Please do your part to keep yourself, your home, and your employees safe, as well as the Leck Waste Services employees.




